Turmoil on the Mission Field



In **South Sudan** the agreement that was signed in September 2018 has resulted in a cease fire, but not a lasting peace. Last month, a United Nations panel citing accelerated recruitment of child soldiers stated that another "full-scale war could happen at any time".

Fearing more conflict, the refugee camps remain full. But this gives the missionaries more opportunities to share Christ before the people

are able to leave and return to their homeland.

In **Ethiopia** in June, there was an attempted coup. A governor, a State Attorney General, and an army Chief General were shot and killed. Many others have been injured, killed, and their properties looted. Tensions among the tribes remains high and hinders the missionaries ministries in rural unprotected places.



Berhanu Yoseph, who trained and mentors the Timothy Project missionaries in Ethiopia and South Sudan, commented in an email recently:

"The situation is getting worse. Movement from one place to another is not easy. People are being attacked for being from a different tribe. One man and his son who lived in a town all their lives were stoned to death just because they belonged to a minority tribe. Honestly, I worry for my children's present and future life in such a divided country. But in such a time, I know it is a great opportunity to do God's will."



In Rakhine State **Myanmar** the missionaries and church members have fled, returned, and fled again as federal and local militias battle one another.

No one is safe from the wrath of either army and unbelievers and Christians must help one another when they are near. As a result, a mutual trust is developing and people are becoming more receptive to the gospel. In August, the four Timothy Project pastors in Rakhine baptized eight new believers.





In spite of what are overwhelming difficulties, the pastors and churches are focused on remaining faithful to the Lord and being a light to the lost in the midst of very dark circumstances.

India: New Life Bible Baptist Church

Thus far \$4,500 has been given toward the church building for New Life Bible Baptist Church in Poduru. Construction will resume shortly, and just \$5,500 more is needed to finish the new building.





Poduru is a town of 10,000. It is near the eastern coast, and the economy is mainly agricultural. Most of the members are field laborers or work in the fishing industry. The people of the town are Hindu (99%) and speak Telugu. All of the members including Pastor Rao were saved out of Hinduism.

Would you pray that the Lord provides for this need? The church would be most grateful.

Last month, Rodney was unable to enter Haiti and his next visit will be delayed until January. On October 28, he departs for India to teach in two Bible schools and explore new opportunities for The Carpenter's Project. Please remember him in your prayers that this trip will be safe and fruitful.
