I Know My Redeemer Lives. Thank you for praying for our Resurrection services and outreaches. We had a good group at both churches with several visitors and children’s parents attending. Dali Faith BC used a skit to take everyone on a “tour” of the Holy Land that ended up at the empty tomb. At Lighthouse BC, the children did a classroom skit that showed how different countries celebrate Easter, but then highlighting the real reason to celebrate – our Risen Savior. After this the teens and adults briefly presented the life of Job to show his unwavering faith in the Redeemer and his hope that he would rise again to be with Him. Services at both churches concluded with a message about our Redeemer to make sure everyone had a clear understanding of the gospel.

Emergency Surgery. As some of you might already know, on the Wednesday before Easter, Andy went to the emergency room at a nearby hospital. After a CT scan and X-ray, the doctor told him that he had appendicitis and needed surgery. At first the seriousness of the situation didn’t hit home, and Andy asked if it could wait until after Easter. Of course, the doctor told him that the operation needed to be done immediately. Praise the Lord, everything went smoothly, and Andy was out of the hospital in two days. Although moving slowly and lacking strength, he was able to attend the services. Recovery to full strength took longer than expected, but Andy is now back to his normal routine. Thank you for your prayers.

A Baptism. *Wu Pei-shan* started attending Lighthouse BC more than a year ago with her husband. She had made a profession of faith at another church but did not receive good Biblical teaching and was confused in some areas. After taking time to make sure of her salvation as well as basic Bible teaching, she was baptized after Easter. Please pray for her to continue to grow in the Lord. Also pray for her husband, *Ji Hong-yu*, to be saved. He understands the gospel but as the eldest son, feels that becoming a Christian would upset his family situation.

Extending The Vision. Recently, both of our churches had an opening in their missionary family. We prayed about this and then Andy presented to the churches an independent Baptist missionary from the Philippines who is serving in Tanzania. After discussion, our folks agreed to the recommendation. This may not seem important but until now their missionary outreach has consisted of ministries in Asia only. Two challenges to our mission’s program are that most do not speak Chinese, so communication is difficult, and these missionaries are not able to come to Taiwan very often and meet our people in person. Please pray that our folks’ spiritual vision will be expanded, and they will be encouraged to be more involved.
